Did you know...

The Second Temple, known in Hebrew as the Beit Hamikdash, was the reconstructed Holy Temple in Jerusalem which stood between 516 BCE and 70 CE. It is also known as Herod's Temple. During this time, it was the center of Jewish life.

You will need...



Black card

Any other colour will also work.



Scissors




Glue Stick



Black felt pen



Yellow pencil



Colour pencils, pens or paint


- 1 Cut out all of the templates on the white card. You should be left with 9 rectangular candle sticks, 2 flames & your menorah.



- 2 Next, take your cut out white menorah template and carefully draw around it with a yellow pencil onto black card.



- 3 Cut out your menorah, cutting off the yellow lines if possible. Put this to one side.



Let's make a menorah window display


- 4 With your black felt tip pen, draw around the largest flame template 9 times on one of the coloured cellophane and cut these out. Repeat with the smaller flame using the other coloured cellophane. You should be left with 9 large and 9 small flames.



- 5 Next, colour in both sides of your candle sticks however you like, using pencils, pens or paints.



- 6 Add a little bit of glue to the top of each candle and stick the large flames to them. Then add a tiny bit of glue to your small flames and stick them on top of the large flames.



- 7 You should now have 8 Chanukah candles and 1 Shamash. You can add 1 candle a day during the 8 days of Chanukah by gluing them to the Chanukiah. Stick this to your window to share your creation with others.
